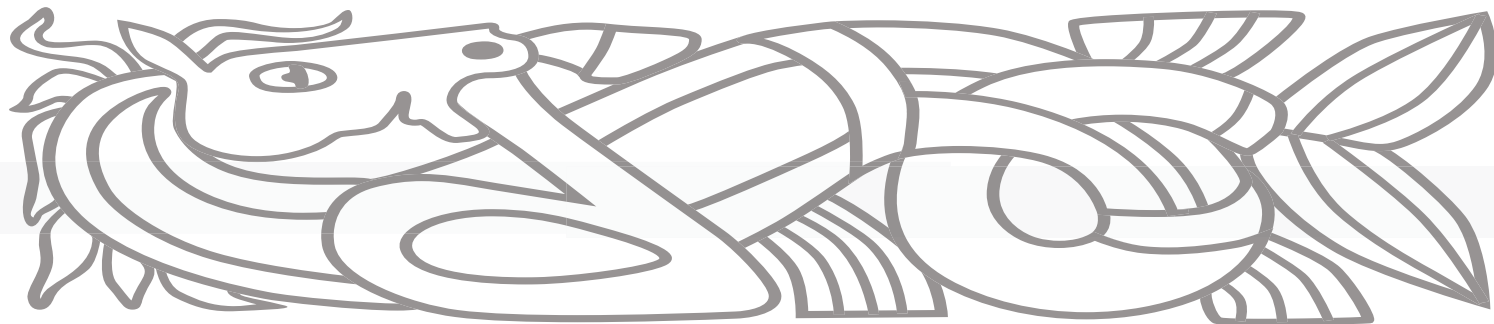

From the North: Take I-75 South to I-275 East to Exit 59a - Milford Parkway

From the South: Take I-75 North to I-275 East to Exit 59a - Milford Parkway

From the West: Take I-275 to Exit 59a - Milford Parkway

At Exit 59a, follow Milford Parkway towards and past the Showcase Cinemas, Target. At the first light before Target, continue on Milford Parkway. At your second light, you will be at US 50, cross US 50. This then becomes East State Route 131. Go approximately 6.2 miles (four lights) to the intersection of State Route 131 and State Route 132 (Williams Corner). At light, take a right and head South on State Route 132 approximately 8/10 of a mile. Majestic Farm is on your left.

Facility Rules

1. All horses must have their show number on their bridle or halter any time outside the stall.
2. Non-competing horses must be registered with the show office and will be given a number to be worn at all times outside of stall.
3. Non competing \$25 schooling fee and stall fee must be paid. Any person(s) riding a schooling horse must have an official entry form and/or release form signed. School horses are not permitted in the warm up area during the competition hours. Fee does not apply to mare/foal as long as one of the pair is a registered competitor.
4. Shavings - shavings will be available at Majestic, \$7.00 per bag. Owners are allowed to bring their own shavings.
5. Judges - it is the purpose of the management to run the Horse Show at the highest possible level of sportsmanship. The management used the utmost care to select judges with broad experience and knowledge. The judge's decisions in the show ring are their own responsibility and the management accepts no responsibility for those decisions.
6. Arenas/Footing - Insulated indoor arena with Martins Collins Footing. 60m x 20m competition rings. Warm-up arena. Designated lunging area with sand all weather footing.
7. Stabling - 12 x 12 stalls in Barn B and Barn C, all with doors. No initial bedding provided. Please specify barn of choice on entry form. Competitors are responsible for all stall damage. ABSOLUTELY NO NAILS, SCREW EYES IN METAL OR WOOD. Every effort is made to honor stabling requests, but we cannot guarantee. When asking to be "stabled with" some-

one please designate one name for your group in the "stable with" section of the entry form. Tack stalls shared between two or more competitors will receive at 10% discount.

8. Dogs - dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Mounted Riders may not lead dogs. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty.

9. Parking - is allowed in designated areas only. Violators improperly parked, including NO PARKING ZONES AND FIRE LANES, will be issued citations and/or towed from the premises at the vehicle owners expense.

10. Overnight/Camping - Limited RV Camping (8 available) in designated sites only. Assigned on first come, first served basis. Fee is \$40 per night, includes water and 30amp electric, no septic lines. There are additional camping options nearby. NO overnight camping except in designated sites!

11. SMOKE FREE FACILITY - there is to be NO SMOKING or open fires within 100 feet of any structure on grounds.

12. Security Notice - concealed weapons are prohibited in this facility

IDHSNA 2016 Annual Horse Show Rules/Definitions

RULES AND DEFINITIONS

The 2016 Annual Show Executive Committee reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to, the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Any question not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the 2016 Annual Show Executive Committee, with their decision to be final. This includes the right to cancel, combine, split and/or add classes or divisions depending on entries.

All horses must have a current Coggins, with the exception of horses under the age of twelve months are to use their dams Coggins. Horses over the age of twelve months must have their own current Coggins. All out of state horses must have a valid Health Certificate dated within 30 days of the start of the show. All horses being ridden must be at least three years old, all horses being ridden over fences must be at least four years old.

DRIVING CLASSES The 2016 Show Committee is happy to announce the addition of Driving to our Performance classes this year! They will run Friday morning at 8:30. (Classes 20 & 21)

To introduce our Driving Classes, we are very excited to have Katie Whaley as our Clinician and Judge. Katie is a Registered judge with the American Driving Society, as well as a well known national and international pairs and 4-in-hand competitor. She is also the owner/designer of Hats by Katie

Katie will conduct an unmounted Driving Clinic on Thursday, September 22 at 5pm - the clinic is open to all.

Our first class will be a Cones Class. This is a test of speed and accuracy. A course of 10 cone "gates" will be set in the arena. Each driver will compete the course twice. Run 1 will be scored on fastest time through the course with fewest penalties. Round 2 will be scored based on most gates completed in a preset time with fewest penalties. Penalty seconds are assessed for knocking off the ball/s that are placed on top of the gates or destroying a gate. Placing decided on lowest combine score.

Our second class will be Driven Dressage, Training Level Test 2 (Presentation on the Move or POM).

The object of the Driven Dressage Test is to judge the freedom, regularity of paces, harmony, impulsion, suppleness, lightness, ease of movement and correct bending of the horses on the move. Athletes will also be judged on style, accuracy, and general control of their horses, and also on their dress, condition of the harness and vehicle, and presentation of their whole turnout.

Driving Rules:

1. Bridles should fit snugly to prevent catching on a vehicle or other pieces of harness. Under no circumstances should a bridle or reins be removed from a horse or pony while they are still hitched to a vehicle. Doing so anywhere on the show grounds will result in elimination. Tying a horse/pony to anything while they are hitched, or leaving a hitched horse unattended, is also forbidden and cause for elimination.
2. All classes will be competed at the walk/trot only. Cantering is prohibited in all driving classes and on the grounds.
3. Every person who rides/drives on a carriage at any time on the grounds, in or out of competition, must sign the liability disclaimer on the entry form.
4. Failure to cross the cones start line within one minute of judges signal may incur elimination.
5. Driving aprons, helmets, gloves, and driving whips are required while driving for all classes.
6. Grooms must be with the carriage and available to assist both inside and outside of the arena.
7. All competitors must report to a safety check and have wheel measurement prior to entering the warm-up arena.

Breed In-Hand classes are to be held in typical IDHS fashion. Horses will be walked clock-wise around the ring. Each horse in the ring must have a handler at all times. Handlers are not to block the Judges view of the horse. Horses are to be turned to their right. Handlers can use an Irish Show Cane or dressage whip. The Ring Steward will assist the Judges in

announcing to the handlers what they are to do.

COP - Certificate of Pedigree

In 2016, the Certificate of Pedigree was launched to certify horses of Irish Draught lineage that can't be registered due to unapproved sires and dams. For the COP, a horse must be able to be DNA tested to a registered ID or IDSH to qualify.

COP horses are being invited to compete at the Annual show in the Performance Classes alongside the registered ID and IDSHs and will be awarded their own placings and Ribbons, there will be a COP show champion! Classes 1 - 17, 20 - 25, 77, 82, 85, 88, 89, 73 - 87, and 45 - 70 are the Performance classes. Please mark COP on entry. COP horses are eligible for IDHSNA Year End Awards!

Horses must have received their certification from the Office of the IDHSNA by the time of the show.

Please go to the society website; www.irishdraught.com, look under Support in the top ribbon, go to forms and find the Certificate of Pedigree Description. Then go to the Registration Forms, check Certificate of Pedigree in the box and follow the instructions on the Forms.

The steps are the same as registering an IDSH and if the sire and/or dam of the COP horse are inspected and approved at some point, the COP horse will be able to be registered as an ID or IDSH.

We are hoping to provide a *home* for IDs and IDSHs that aren't able to be registered but are active and valuable equines.

CONNEMARA PONIES

Registered Connemara Ponies and ACPs Members are also invited to compete in the same Performance Classes!

The Connemarars will receive their own placings and ribbons!

Please find the space on the entry form for CP/CPSH

Dressage Prospect classes are held in accordance with USDF Rules, which can be found on the USDF website. In these classes horses are shown one at a time and on the triangle. Please note that these classes are for horses between the ages of zero- and three-years old. Foals must be shown in a halter and may be accompanied by their dam (both animals require a handler at all times), yearlings may be shown in either a halter or a bridle; two- and three-year olds must be shown in a bridle, with either reins or a New Market shank. Handlers may request to use an assistant with a whip if they feel it is needed.

Hunter classes are judged in accordance with USEF rules. In case of a tie, the horses with the most points over fences, will be awarded the higher placing. Hunter Pairs classes to be judged on similarity of horses/riders and quality of performance as a hunter pair. Jumper classes are judged in accordance with USEF rules. The Jumper classes, unless otherwise noted, will be run in accordance with USEF rules in Table II, Sec. 2(b), which means that the jump off occurs immediately following the course without leaving the ring.

For the purposes of this show, an AMATEUR is one, who does not train horses under saddle or in harness for profit, or does not teach riding lessons or accept remuneration for showing horses in-hand, under saddle or in harness. One who trains horses in-hand only as part of a breeding operation is not disqualified as an amateur. In cases of dispute of amateur status, the 2016 Annual Show Executive Committee will make the final decision.

ATTIRE: Below are the recommendations for appropriate attire in each discipline. Note that this is left up to the judgment of the individual and in all instances the 2016 Annual Show Executive Committee would recommend a neat and tidy appearance.

Dressage – riders to dress in a black or navy jacket, stock, white shirt, cream or white breeches with black boots. Handlers in the Dressage Prospect classes typically wear a polo style shirt with khaki type pants/slacks and either Jodhpur boots or tennis shoes.

Hunters - riders to dress in a riding jacket, shirt, appropriate choker, tie or stock, breeches, and boots.

In-Hand - handlers and assistants to wear appropriate attire for showing horses in-hand, allowing freedom of movement and protective hand, head

and footwear is recommended. Suggested dress may include boots and breeches, khaki pants and button down or polo style shirt. Comfortable shoes for running. Riding helmet or hat is permissible.

Jumpers – riders are encouraged to dress in a riding jacket, shirt, appropriate choker or tie, however, collared shirts are acceptable along with breeches, and boots.

Driving Class Attire - Conservative dress is encouraged, such as jacket, long sleeves, tie/scarf, dark slacks, appropriate dark footwear and gloves, preferably brown.

*At all times, appropriate safety head gear is to be worn by any and all mounted riders.

*If the weather is extremely hot, it is up to the discretion of the 2016 show committee to determine acceptable riding attire.

Stallion Parade – participants in the Stallion Parade on Saturday, September 24, 2016 need to fill out a Stallion Parade Information Sheet on their stallion(s) and submit them to Ann Morss no later than Saturday, August 27, 2016 if they wish to participate in the parades. Forms are to be emailed to annmorss@msn.com

Parkmore Pride Memorial Young Handler Championship Hand - Competitors will be required to wear formal in hand show attire, shirt and tie or stock, Beige or dark pants, paddock boots, Jacket and riding helmet. No polo shirts and ABSOLUTELY NO RUNNING SHOES ALLOWED. Under saddle : Competitors will be required to wear formal riding attire, shirt and tie or stock, breeches long boots, jacket and riding helmet.

TURN OUT: Below are the recommended minimum requirements for appropriate turn out for each discipline.

Dressage – horse to be clean, manes braided. Appropriate bit, whip and spurs for the level of test being ridden. Horses tack to be in accordance with USDF rules.

Combined Tests – horses to be clean, manes braided for the Dressage portion. Appropriate bit, whip and spurs for the level of the test/course being ridden. Horses tack to be in accordance with USEA rules.

Hunters – horses to be clean, manes braided. Appropriate tack for the type of class entered. Horses tack to be in accordance with USHJA rules.

In-Hand – horses to be clean, manes on horse's one-year of age or older braided for the Irish Breed classes and Dressage. Purebred horses should not have their fetlock hair trimmed off. Horses tails should be neat and tidy.

Jumpers – horses to be clean, manes need not be braided. Horses tack to be in accordance with USEF rules.

Parkmore Pride Memorial Young Handler Championship Hand - Tack should be clean, well-fitting and in good, safe, condition.

FEH Series - Please note that for FEH Series classes the USEA recommends that manes be neat and tidy and are not required to be braided. Horses tack to be in accordance with USEA FEH Series rules.

During In-hand showing, competitors should be able to stand a horse up correctly for the judges and during the trot up should turn the horse away from them. Under saddle the riders should be able to recognize being on the correct diagonal in trot and strike off on the correct lead in canter.

Dressage Divisions:

Intro Level (classes 1, 2 and 3) - Horses to perform the Intro Tests (A,B, C)

Training Level (classes 7,8, and 9) – Horse to perform the Training Tests (1, 2, and 3)

First Level (classes 11, 12, and 13) – Horse to perform the First Level Tests (1, 2, and 3)

Second Level (classes 14, 15, and 16) - Horse to perform the Second Level Tests (1, 2, and 3)

Dressage Suitability (class 17) – This class is open to horses that have just started their careers. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on the horse's potential to become a Dressage

mount.

Purebred/Partbred Dressage Prospect (classes 18 and 19) – This class is open to horses from the age of zero to three-years old, to be shown on the triangle in accordance with USDF rules.

Driving - cones class (class 20 - cones class) – Runs 1 and 2, details on page 9.

Driving - Driven Dressage Class (Class 21) - Training Level, Test 2, POM (Presentation on the Move) Test is included on pages 20 and 21.

Breed In-Hand Classes and Divisions:

Purebred Filly Foals (class 26) – This class is open to all purebred 2016 filly foals.

Purebred Colt Foals (class 27) – This class is open to all purebred 2016 colt foals.

Purebred Foal Championship - Open to 2016 foals who received a first or second place ribbon in class 26 or 27.

The Mountain Dove Tribute Class for RID Mares Four-years Old and up (class 28) – Open to RID Mares four years of age or older.

Purebred Yearlings (class 29) – Open to Purebred 2015 fillies, colts, and geldings.

Purebred Two-Year Olds (class 30) - Open to Purebred 2014 fillies, colts, and geldings.

Purebred Three-Year Olds (class 31) - Open to Purebred 2013 fillies, colts, and geldings.

Purebred Youngstock Championship – Open to horses who received a first or second place ribbon in classes 26, 27, 29, 30 and 31.

Purebred Female Championship – Open to mares and fillies who received a first or second place ribbon in classes 26, 28, 29, 30 and 31.

Purebred Geldings Four-Years Old and up (class 32) – Open to RID geldings four-years old and older.

Purebred Stallions Four-Years Old and up (class 33) – Open to RID stallions four-years old and older.

Purebred In-Hand Championship – Open to horses who received a first or second place ribbons in classes 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32 and 33.

Get of Sire (class 34) – Two to three get of a single RID Sire to be judged as a group. Use appropriate tack and turn out for the age of each entry. Coordination with the Stallion Owner is recommended. Entry for this class will occur at the show no later than 9:00 AM on Saturday, September 24, 2016.

Progeny of Dam (class 35) - Two or more progeny of a single RID Dam to be judged as a group. Use appropriate tack and turn out for the age of each entry. Coordination with the Mare Owner is recommended. Entry for this class will occur at the show no later than 9:00 AM on Saturday, September 24, 2016

Partbred Filly Foals (class 36) – This class is open to all partbred 2016 filly foals.

Partbred Colt Foals (class 37) – This class is open to all partbred 2016 colt foals.

Partbred Foal Championship - Open to 2016 foals who received a first or second place ribbon in class 36 and 37.

Partbred Mares Four-years Old and up (class 38) - Open to RIDSH Mares four years of age or older.

Partbred Yearlings (class 39) – Open to Partbred 2015 fillies, colts, and geldings.

Partbred Two-Year Olds (class 40) - Open to Partbred 2014 fillies, colts, and geldings.

Partbred Three-Year Olds (class 41) - Open to Partbred 2013 fillies, colts, and geldings.

Partbred Youngstock Championship - Open to horses who received a first or second place ribbon in classes 36, 37, 39, 40, and 41.

Partbred Geldings Four-Years Old and up (class 42) – Open to RIDSH geldings four-years old and older.

Partbred Stallions Four-Years Old and up (class 43) – Open to RIDSH stallions four-years old and older.

Partbred In-Hand Championship - Open to horses who received a first or second place ribbon in classes 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, and 43.

Junior Handler (44) Open to handlers 18 years and under. Handlers may handle yearlings, two year olds, three year olds, mares, and geldings (stallions not permitted). To be judged on handling technique and turnout of horse and handler. Competitors to be judged over the duration of the show on barn management and etiquette, handling technique and turnout of horse and handler. Handlers are required to braid their own horses. Handlers to wear a helmet if handling a yearling, two year old or three year old.

Youngstock Utility (88) Purebred and Partbred horses ages yearling to three year old will be judged over a series of obstacles which could include walking over a tarp, backing through an L, having an umbrella opened, or opening a gate. To

be judged on relaxed navigation through the course.

Mounted Utility (89) - Purebred and Partbred horses ages 4 and up will be judged over a series of obstacles which could include walking over a tarp, backing through an L, having an umbrella opened, or opening a gate. To be judged on relaxed navigation through the course.

The Snowford Bellman Award - Open to all horses and handlers; not open to professional handlers. The intent of this award is to recognize a special relationship between the handler and their horse. This award is to be presented to the combination that may not be a winning one, but the partnership has demonstrated their best abilities in showmanship, presence, turnout and training. To be judged by the Irish Judges over the course of the In-Hand classes during the show.

Hunter Divisions:

Warm Up Class (class 45) - This class is for horses that are just beginning their careers; choice of either 18" or 2' fences.

Warm Up Class (class 46) - This class is for horses that are just beginning their careers; 2'6" fences.

First Timers Hunter (class 47) - This class is for horses that are just beginning their careers; they must be able to jump 6 fences at 18".

Baby Green Hunter (classes 48, 49, & 50) - This division is for horses that are in their first or second year of showing and must be able to jump 8 fences at 2' and walk, trot and canter in a group.

Rusty Stirrup (51, 52, & 53) This division is for riders that are novice riders or are have not ridden for a number of years. There will be 8 fences at 2' and a walk, trot, canter in a group.

Novice Hunter (classes 54, 55 & 56) - This division is for horses that have not won a division championship at 2'6" or higher. They will jump a regular hunter course at 2'6".

Junior Hunter (57, 58, & 59) Riders under age 18 will jump a course of fences at 2'6".

Fox Hunter Turnout (class 60) Both Horse and Rider will be judged on turnout. Attire and tack to be appropriate for the hunt field.

Fox Hunter (61, 62, & 63) - Horses will jump 2'6" - 3'0" and may be asked to demonstrate hunter field skills (i.e., open/close a gate, drop a pole, lead over a fence, back 5-steps, etc.) Note that one fence will be taken at the discretion of the rider to best demonstrate their horse's suitability as a field hunter.

Warm Up 3' (64)

Low Hunter (classes 65, 66, & 67) - Horses will jump a hunter course of fences at 3'.

Working Hunter (68, 69, & 70) - Horses will jump a hunter course of fences at 3'3"-3'6".

Purebred/Partbred Irish Hunters Horses (classes 71 and 72) - Horses to be shown under saddle at a walk, trot, canter, halt, back 5-steps, and hand gallop in both directions of the ring. A riding judge will mount and ride each horse. The horses may have their saddles removed, asked to be set up and shown in hand at the walk and trot for the conformation portion of the class.

Jumper Divisions:

Puddle Jumpers (classes 73 and 74) - These two classes are for horses that are in their first or second year of showing over fences and must be able to jump 8 fences at 2'.

Baby Jumpers (classes 75 and 76) - These two classes are for horses that have not won a division championship at 2'6" or

higher. Horses must be able to jump a course at 2'6".

Level One Jumpers (classes 78 and 79) - Horses will jump a course of fences at 2'9" - 3'.

Junior Jumpers (80 and 81) Riders under 18 will jump a course of fences 2'9" - 3'.

Level Two Jumpers (classes 83 and 84) - Horses will jump a course of fences at 3'0" - 3'3".

Level Three Jumpers (classes 86 and 87) - Horses will jump a course of fences at 3'3" - 3'6".

The Calcutta Derby Returns!! Calling all Jumpers! On Saturday evening we will hold a Calcutta Derby! Entry is open to all registered competitors. Entry fees for this class will be \$35.

\$20 of each entry will go to a cash pot for 1st - 5th places. More entries - more prize money! Immediately following the AGM (Approximately 7:00PM), we will auction off the horse/rider teams entered in the Derby. Each team will be auctioned to the highest bidder (riders may bid on themselves). Auction Pot will be split with 50% going to IDHSNA and 50% going to the purchaser of the winning team! Upon completion of auction, each team will tackle the jumping course (maximum height no more than 3'). Table II, Sect. 2 (b). Riders will draw for order of go.

Combined Test Divisions:

Beginner Novice (Classes 4 and 77) will perform USEA 2014 Beginner Novice Test B and jump a regular jumper course set at a maximum height of 2'7"

Novice (classes 5 and 82) - Will perform the USEA 2014 Novice Test B and jump a regular jumper course set at a maximum height of 2'11".

Training (classes 6 and 85) - Will perform the USEA 2014 Training Test B and jump a regular jumper course set at a maximum height of 3'3".

Parkmore Pride Memorial Young Handler Championship - Open to 16 - 21 year olds. To be judged on barn management, riding and/or showing in hand. Competitors will be judged in four sections,

1. Their ability to prepare a horse for show (bathing and braiding);
2. Put on a bridle and correctly fit a saddle.
3. Show a horse in hand and correctly present the horse to the judges, or show a horse under saddle. and
4. Turn out of Handler.

Prize awarded of trophy to the winner in addition to a 1 week training course at Parkmore Stud with Fleur Bryan.

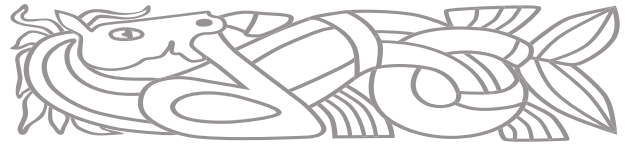

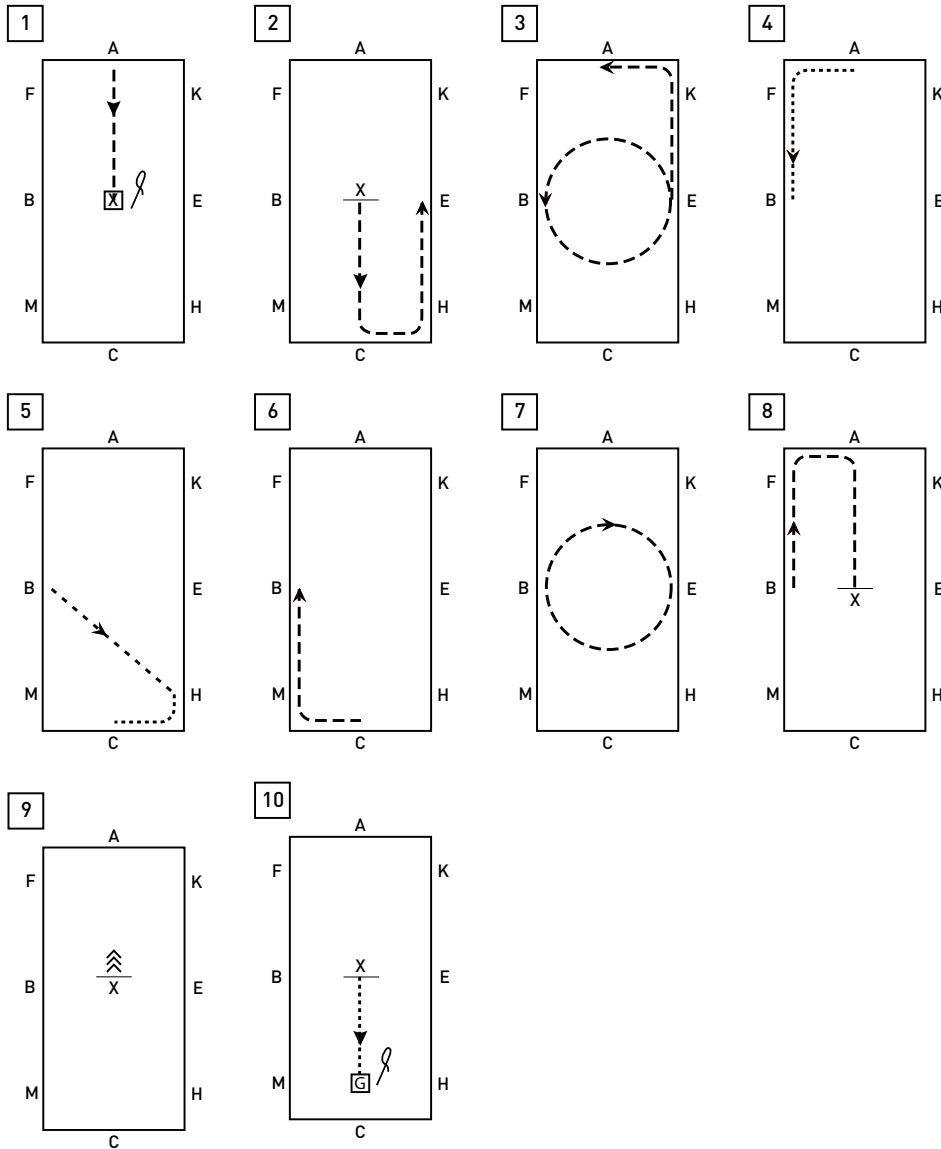

To establish that the correct foundation is being laid for the training of the driving horse requiring the green horse to move freely and energetically forward in a steady rhythm in the working walk and the working trot, while accepting the bit with relaxation, through transitions and 40 meter circles. Increased engagement of the hindquarters (impulsion) cannot be expected yet. This level is also intended to encourage the inexperienced driver.
