*The Meeting will be held at **6:00 PM** and will be followed by a potluck dinner at **7:30 PM.***

**SHOW PROGRAM:** Non-members may advertise in the National Show Program as long as the IDHSNA Advertising Guidelines are followed.

**ADVERTISING:** The following guidelines apply to advertising in any IDHSNA publication, website, regional website, regional newsletter, promotional booth, DVD/Video or other society funded/organized advertising including articles about the breed in outside publications.

- The IDHSNA reserves the right to refuse any advertisement that may include material it deems inappropriate.
- The IDHSNA assumes no responsibility for the truth, accuracy or validity of any advertisement or contribution published. Statements, opinions and points of view expressed by contributors and advertisers are not necessarily those of the IDHSNA. The IDHSNA reserves the right to deny placing advertising or contributions that are deemed damaging or are contrary to the goals of the Society. - Any horse being advertised within official society publications or in society funded advertising, must be listed under its

name recorded with the IDHSNA.

- Any member submitting a photograph taken by a professional photographer must have permission from the photographer to use the photo on the internet or in publications.
- When using photographs, credit should be given whenever possible. Members can be credited and professional photographers should have their credit hyperlinked to their site/e-mail.
- Horses shown in photos used by the IDHSNA for advertising the society or the breed should fall within these suggested guidelines:
  - be registered with the IDHSNA in one of their studbooks, or
  - be foals under 1 year of age where at least one parent is registered as RID or RIDSH in one of the IDHSNA studbooks, or
  - be registered with the IHB, IDHS, IDHSCAN or IDHSGB or have provable RID blood.
  - Photos of horses that have failed inspection and are not approved may not be used.

If there are no clean rounds and a tie exists for first place, there will be one jumpoff in which time will decide in the event of equality of faults. It is recommended that no more than ten numbered obstacles be included in the first round when the class is scored under this table.

**Combined Test Divisions:**

Novice (classes 4 and 77) – Will perform the USEA Novice Test A and jump a regular jumper course set at a maximum height of 2'11".

Training (classes 8 and 80) – Will perform the USEA Training Test A and jump a regular jumper course set at a maximum height of 3'3".

**USEA Future Event Horse (FEH) Series:**

In these classes horses are shown one at a time and on the triangle. Please note that these classes are for horses between the ages of one- and three-years old. Yearlings may be shown in either a halter or a bridle; two- and three-year olds must be shown in a bridle, with either reins or a New Market shank. Handlers may request to use an assistant with a whip if they feel it is needed.

NOTE: Exhibitors/Owners of horses in the FEH Series do not need to be members of the IDHSNA and their horses do not need to be registered with IDHSNA; however, horses MUST be registered with USEA.

FEH Yearling Division (classes 86 and 87) – Open to yearlings, they will be judged on the triangle, and in accordance with USEA FEH

rules. Yearlings may be shown in either a halter or bridle.

FEH Yearling Fillies (class 86) – Open to yearling fillies.

FEH Yearling Colts/Geldings (class 87) – Open to yearling colts and geldings

FEH Yearling Championship – Open to horses that have won a first or second place ribbon in classes 86 and 87

Two-Year Old Division (classes 88 and 89) – Open to two-year olds, they will be judged on the triangle, and in accordance with USEA FEH rules. Two-year olds must be shown in a bridle.

FEH Two-Year Old Fillies (class 88) – Open to two-year old fillies

FEH Two-Year Old Colts/Geldings (class 89) – Open to two-year old colts and geldings

FEH Two-Year Old Championship – Open to horses that have won a first or second place ribbon in classes 88 and 89

Three-Year Old Division (classes 90 and 91) – Open to three-year olds, they will be judged on the triangle, and in accordance with USEA FEH Rules. Three-year olds must be shown in a bridle.

FEH Three-Year Old Fillies (class 90) – Open to three-year old fillies

FEH Three-Year Old Colts/Geldings (class 91) – Open to three-year old colts and geldings

FEH Three-Year Old Championship – Open to horses that have won a first or second place ribbon in classes 90 and 91

FEH Overall Championship – Open to the champion and reserve champion for the Yearling, Two-Year Old and Three-Year Old Division.

Partbred Yearlings (class 62) - Open to Partbred 2010 fillies, colts, and geldings.

Partbred Two-Year Olds (class 63) - Open to Partbred 2009 fillies, colts, and geldings.

Partbred Three-Year Olds (class 64) - Open to Partbred 2008 fillies, colts, and geldings.

Partbred Youngstock Championship - Open to horses who received a first or second place ribbon in classes 59, 60, 62, 63, and 64.

Partbred Geldings Four-Years Old and up (class 65) - Open to RIDSH geldings four-years old and older.

Partbred Stallions Four-Years Old and up (class 66) - Open to RIDSH stallions four-years old and older.

Partbred In-Hand Championship - Open to horses who received a first or second place ribbon in classes 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, and 66.

Junior Handler (67) Open to handlers 18 years and under. Handlers may handle yearlings, two year olds, three year olds, mares, and geldings (stallions not permitted). To be judged on handling technique and turnout of horse and handler. Competitors to be judged over the duration of the show on barn management and etiquette, handling technique and turnout of horse and handler. Handlers are required to braid their own horses. Handlers to wear a helmet if handling a yearling, two year old or three year old.

Youngstock Utility: (68) Purebred and Partbred horses ages yearling to three year old will be judged over a series of obstacles which could include walking over a tarp, backing through an L, having an umbrella opened, or opening a gate. To be judged on relaxed navigation through the course.

The Snowford Bellman Award - Open to all horses and handlers; not open to professional handlers. The intent of this award is to recognize a special relationship between the handler and their horse. This award is to be presented to the combination that may not be a winning one, but the partnership has demonstrated their best abilities in showmanship, presence, turnout and training. To be judged by the Irish Judges over the course of the In-Hand classes during the show.

**Jumper Divisions:**

Puddle Jumpers (classes 69 and 70) -

These two classes are for horses that are in their first or second year of showing over fences and must be able to jump 8 fences at 2'.

Baby Jumpers (classes 71 and 72) - These two classes are for horses that have not won a division championship at 2'6" or higher. Horses must be able to jump a course at 2'6".

Level One Jumpers (classes 73 and 74) - Horses will jump a course of fences at 2'9" - 3'

Junior Jumpers (75 and 76) Riders under 18 will jump a course of fences 2'9" - 3'

Level Two Jumpers (classes 78 and 79) - Horses will jump a course of fences at 3'0" - 3'3".

Level Three Jumpers (classes 81 and 82) - Horses will jump a course of fences at 3'3" - 3'6"

Level Four Jumpers (classes 83 and 84) - Horses will jump a course of fences at 3'6" - 3'9"

Eventing Calcutta Derby (85) All rider/horse teams will submit a biography to be read by the announcer in order to auction the horses to the spectators. Spectators bid on who they think the winning pair will be. All funds go into a pot and are split 1/3 to the winning horse & rider, 1/3 to the spectator that bid on the winner and 1/3 to the show. Fences will be 3'0 - 3'6" and there will be at least 8 obstacles. If you jump a clean round than you move to the jump off using Table II, Section 2(b).

The first round and first jump/off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, the competitor will, without leaving the ring, upon an audible signal, commence the designated jump/off course. A competitor with a clear round may dismount, and with assistance if necessary, adjust tack and/or equipment; however, upon the audible signal to begin his/her round, the competitor is responsible for adhering to the 45 seconds rule as per JP134.3. A competitor who leaves the arena after a clear round (before or

Rusty Stirrup (25, 26, & 27) This division is for riders that are novice riders or are have not ridden for a number of years. There will be 8 fences at 2' and a walk, trot, canter in a group.

Novice Hunter (classes 28, 29 & 30) - This division is for horses that have not won a division championship at 2'6" or higher. They will jump a regular hunter course at 2'6".

Hunter Pairs Hack (class 31) – This class is for horses of similar color and size, to be ridden side-by-side at a walk, trot, and canter in both directions of the ring; may be asked to halt, back 5-steps or hand gallop.

Hunter Pairs Over Fences (class 32) – This class is for horses of similar color and size, to be ridden over fences at 2'6". They will be asked to jump 5 fences, the first two fences in tandem with one horse in the lead, jump a fence in the middle side-by-side, and then jump the last two fences in tandem with the other horse in the lead.

Warm Up 3' (33)

Low Hunter (classes 34, 35, & 36) – Horses will jump a hunter course of fences at 3'.

Junior Hunter (37, 38, & 39) Riders under age 18 will jump a course of fences at 3'.

Fox Hunter Turnout (class 40) Both Horse and Rider will be judged on turnout. Attire and tack to be appropriate for the hunt field.

Fox Hunter (41, 42, & 43) - Horses will jump 3'0" and may be asked to demonstrate hunter field skills (i.e., open/close a gate, drop a pole, lead over a fence, back 5-steps, etc.) Note that one fence will be taken at the discretion of the rider to best demonstrate their horse's suitability as a field hunter.

Working Hunter (44, 45, & 46) – Horses will jump a hunter course of fences at 3'3".

Purebred/Partbred Irish Hunters Horses (classes 47 and 48) – Horses to be shown under saddle at a walk, trot, canter, halt, back 5-steps, and hand gallop in both directions of the ring. A riding judge will mount and ride each horse. The horses may have their saddles removed, asked to be set up and shown in hand at the walk and trot for the conformation portion of the class.

**Breed In-Hand Classes and Divisions:**

Purebred Filly Foals (class 49) – This class is open to all purebred 2011 filly foals.

Purebred Colt Foals (class 50) – This class is open to all purebred 2011 colt foals.

Purebred Foal Championship - Open to 2011

foals who received a first or second place ribbon in class 49 or 50.

The Mountain Dove Tribute Class for RID Mares Four-years Old and up (class 51) – Open to RID Mares four years of age or older.

Purebred Yearlings (class 52) – Open to Purebred 2010 fillies, colts, and geldings.

Purebred Two-Year Olds (class 53) - Open to Purebred 2009 fillies, colts, and geldings.

Purebred Three-Year Olds (class 54) - Open to Purebred 2008 fillies, colts, and geldings.

Purebred Youngstock Championship – Open to horses who received a first or second place ribbon in classes 49, 50, 52, 53 and 54.

Purebred Female Championship – Open to mares and fillies who received a first or second place ribbon in classes 49, 51, 52, 53 and 54.

Purebred Geldings Four-Years Old and up (class 55) – Open to RID geldings four-years old and older.

Purebred Stallions Four-Years Old and up (class 56) – Open to RID stallions four-years old and older.

Purebred In-Hand Championship – Open to horses who received a first or second place ribbons in classes 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, and 56.

Get of Sire (class 57) – Two to three get of a single RID Sire to be judged as a group. Use appropriate tack and turn out for the age of each entry. Coordination with the Stallion Owner is recommended. Entry for this class will occur at the show no later than 9:00 AM on Saturday, August 20, 2011.

Progeny of Dam (class 58) - Two or more progeny of a single RID Dam to be judged as a group. Use appropriate tack and turn out for the age of each entry. Coordination with the Mare Owner is recommended. Entry for this class will occur at the show no later than 9:00 AM on Saturday, August 20, 2011.

Partbred Filly Foals (class 59) – This class is open to all partbred 2011 filly foals.

Partbred Colt Foals (class 60) – This class is open to all partbred 2011 colt foals.

Partbred Foal Championship - Open to 2011 foals who received a first or second place ribbon in class 59 and 60.

Partbred Broodmares Four-years Old and up (class 61) - Open to RIDSH Mares four years of age or older.

**Dressage** – riders to dress in a black or navy jacket, stock, white shirt, cream or white breeches with black boots. Handlers in the Dressage Prospect classes typically wear a polo style shirt with khaki type pants/slacks and either Jodhpur boots or tennis shoes.

**Hunters** - riders to dress in a riding jacket, shirt, appropriate choker, tie or stock, breeches, and boots.

**In-Hand** - handlers and assistants to wear appropriate attire for showing horses in-hand, allowing freedom of movement and protective hand, head and footwear is recommended. Suggested dress may include boots and breeches, khaki pants and button down or polo style shirt. Comfortable shoes for running. Riding helmet or hat is permissible.

**Jumpers** – riders are encouraged to dress in a riding jacket, shirt, appropriate choker or tie, however, collared shirts are acceptable along with breeches, and boots.

**USEA FEH Series** - handlers in the FEH series classes typically wear a polo style shirt with khaki type pants/slacks and either Jodhpur boots or tennis shoes.

**Stallion Parade** – participants in the Stallion Parade on Saturday, August 20, 2011 and Sunday, August 21, 2011 need to fill out a Stallion Parade Information Sheet on their stallion(s) and submit them to Jess Walker no later than Friday, August 19, 2011 if they wish to participate in the parades. Forms are to be emailed to (insert Jess's e-mail).

*At all times appropriate safety head gear is to be worn by any and all mounted riders.*

*If the weather is extremely hot it is up to the discretion of the 2011 Annual Show Executive Committee to determine acceptable riding attire.*

**TURN OUT:** Below are the recommended minimum requirements for appropriate turn out for each discipline.

**Dressage** – horse to be clean, manes braided. Appropriate bit, whip and spurs for the level of test being ridden. Horses tack to be in accordance with USDF rules.

**Combined Tests** – horses to be clean, manes braided for the Dressage portion. Appropriate bit, whip and spurs for the level of the test/course being ridden. Horses tack to be in accordance with USEA rules.

**Hunters** – horses to be clean, manes braided. Appropriate tack for the type of class entered.

Horses tack to be in accordance with USHJA rules.

**In-Hand** – horses to be clean, manes on horse's one-year of age or older braided for the Irish Breed classes and Dressage. Purebred horses should not have their fetlock hair trimmed off. Horses tails should be neat and tidy.

**Jumpers** – horses to be clean, manes need not be braided. Horses tack to be in accordance with USEF rules.

**USEA FEH** - Please note that for the FEH Series classes the USEA recommends that manes be neat and tidy and are not required to be braided. Horses tack to be in accordance with USEA FEH Series Rules.

**DIVISIONS LISTINGS & CLASS DEFINITIONS**

**Dressage Divisions:**

**Intro Level** (classes 1, 2 and 3) - Horses to perform the Intro Tests (A,B, C)

**Dressage Junior Equitation** (16) Judged on correctness of riders seat and aids. Riders to be judged at walk, trot, and canter.

**Dressage Suitability** (class 17) – This class is open to horses that have just started their careers. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on the horse's potential to become a Dressage mount.

**Purebred/Partbred Dressage Prospect** (classes 18 and 19) – This class is open to horses from the age of zero to three-years old, to be shown on the triangle in accordance with USDF rules.

**Hunter Divisions:**

**Warm Up Class** (class 20) – This class is for horses that are just beginning their careers; choice of either 18" or 2' fences.

**First Timers Hunter** (class 21) – This class is for horses that are just beginning their careers; they must be able to jump 6 fences at 18".

**Baby Green Hunter** (classes 22, 23, & 24) - This division is for horses that are in their first or second year of showing and must be able to jump 8 fences at 2' and walk, trot and canter in a group.

**CLASS RULES**

The 2011 Annual Show Executive Committee reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to, the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Any question not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the 2011 Annual Show Executive Committee, with their decision to be final. This includes the right to cancel, combine, split and/or add classes or divisions depending on entries.

All competitor horses must be registered with the IDHSNA except for those horses competing ONLY in the Future Event Horse (FEH) Series Classes which will run under the United States Eventing Association rules and regulations. All owners of horses competing must be members in good standing of the IDHSNA. Horses competing only in the USEA FEH Series do not need to be registered with the IDHSNA.

All horses must have a current Coggins, with the exception of horses under the age of twelve months are to use their dams Coggins. Horses over the age of twelve months must have their own current Coggins. All out of state horses must have a valid Health Certificate dated within 30 days of the start of the show. All horses being ridden must be at least three years old, all horses being ridden over fences must be at least four years old.

The same horse can only compete in two consecutive divisions in any discipline (e.g., Dressage, Hunters and Jumpers). An example would be that in Dressage a horse is allowed to compete in Intro and Training Level Divisions; in Hunters a horse is allowed to compete in Novice and Low Hunters Divisions; and in Jumpers a horse is allowed to compete in Level Three and Level Four Divisions.

*FEH Series* classes are held in accordance with USEA FEH Rules, which can be found on the USEA website. In these classes horses are shown one at a time and on the triangle. Please note that these classes are for horses between the ages of one- and three-years old. Yearlings may be shown in either a halter or a bridle; two- and three-year olds must be shown in a bridle, with either reins or a New Market shank. Handlers may request to use an assistant with a whip if they feel it is needed. Horses entered in the USEA FEH Series classes must use the USEA Entry Form and be registered with the USEA. Horses entered in the USEA FEH Series do not have to be registered with the IDHSNA.

*Breed In-Hand* Classes are to be held in typical IDHS fashion. Horses will be walked clock-wise

around the ring. Each horse in the ring must have a handler at all times. Handlers are not to block the Judges view of the horse. Horses are to be turned to their right. Handlers can use an Irish Show Cane or dressage whip. The Ring Steward will assist the Judges in announcing to the handlers what they are to do.

Competitors wishing to provide a demonstration in the Dressage Freestyle Test of Choice must note which test they will be performing on their Entry Form and riders must present music on a good quality CD disk at least two hours prior to their scheduled demonstration time.

*Dressage Prospect* classes are held in accordance with USDF Rules, which can be found on the USDF website. In these classes horses are shown one at a time and on the triangle. Please note that these classes are for horses between the ages of zero- and three-years old. Foals must be shown in a halter and may be accompanied by their dam (both animals require a handler at all times), yearlings may be shown in either a halter or a bridle; two- and three-year olds must be shown in a bridle, with either reins or a New Market shank. Handlers may request to use an assistant with a whip if they feel it is needed.

*Hunter* classes are judged in accordance with USEF rules. In case of a tie, the horses with the most points over fences, will be awarded the higher placing. Hunter Pairs classes to be judged on similarity of horses/riders and quality of performance as a hunter pair. Jumper classes are judged in accordance with USEF rules. The Jumper classes, unless otherwise noted, will be run in accordance with USEF rules in Table II, Sec. 2(b), which means that the jump off occurs immediately following the course without leaving the ring.

For the purposes of this show, an AMATEUR is one, who does not train horses under saddle or in harness for profit, or does not teach riding lessons or accept remuneration for showing horses in-hand, under saddle or in harness. One who trains horses in-hand only as part of a breeding operation is not disqualified as an amateur. In cases of dispute of amateur status, the 2011 Annual Show Executive Committee will make the final decision.

**ATTIRE:** Below are the recommendations for appropriate attire in each discipline. Note that this is left up to the judgment of the individual and in all instances the 2011 Annual Show Executive Committee would recommend a neat and tidy appearance.

### Facility Rules:

- **Coggins:** The IL Department of Agriculture and IL law requires that all Illinois equine more than 12 months old participating in advertised equine events are required to have a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) (negative Coggins) within the past 12 months if the animal is more than 12 months of age.
- **Fire/Rescue:** 911
- **Dogs:** Dogs must be on a leash and under control at all times. Owners of Dogs that disrupt a competitors round will be required to pay the affected horses entry fee in said class. Owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dog's behaviors.
- **Feed and Bedding:** Can be ordered through the show office. Initial bedding can be ordered via the stall reservation form or by contacting the show organizer.
- **Motorized Vehicles:** Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license.
- No smoking at the arenas or in the barns.
- Drive carefully and obey all traffic signs.
- No trash or sharps in the manure pits.
- Lunging in schooling rings only.
- No overnight horses may be stabled in trailers or tied out.
- Horses are absolutely not allowed to be ponied behind any moving vehicles.
- No vehicles allowed in the barns.
- Any loss, theft, accident or disturbance should be reported to the Show Management.
